Single Family, private residential dwellings within the service limits of CRMU. Any customer connecting a distributed generation resource will immediately be subject to 7/1/2017 rates.

### Applicability Detail

Available to a single family, private residential dwelling at 60 Hertz, single phase service at a nominal operating voltage of 120/240 volts furnished through one meter for domestic purposes only including lighting, small domestic appliances, water heating, supplemental space heating, refrigeration, cooking and domestic single phase motors rated 5 HP or less. Service to multiple dwelling units or an apartment house through a single meter is not permitted.

A residential dwelling is defined as any structure which wholly used or intended to be used for private living or sleeping by human occupants and as any habitable building, room or group adjoining habitable rooms located with a dwelling and forming a single unit with facilities which are to be used for living, sleeping, and the cooking and/or eating of meals. This includes SEPARATELY METERED single family dwellings (including incidental farm usage supplied through the same meter), condominiums/townhouses, two-family dwellings (duplexes), multiple family dwellings (contains three or more dwelling units), efficiency apartment units. Any apartment or living unit which has separate, permanent kitchen facilities shall be considered as one single, private residence for application of this rule.

This rate does not include: hotels, motels, bed & breakfasts, rooming houses, multiple family dwellings (two or more units) served through one common meter, service to multiple dwelling or apartment house common use areas such as laundry rooms, garages, heating plants, lighting, central air conditioning, farm/agricultural operations, and service to separately metered residential structures where there is no dwelling unit (garages, barns, pumps, etc.) Service for residential and commercial purposes may be combined through a single meter, but the service shall be billed under the GS1 - General Service Rate Schedule.
